Years of Operation

The CFFQI was created by the Provincial Government as a mechanism to sustain the gains of the then RP-German CFPQ and the RP-German DfNSIP. Its creation was covered with a MOA entered into by the PGQ and 7 parties (Local & National).

The Philippine-German Community Forestry Project –Quirino initiated a process to establish a FOUNDATION which will take prominent responsibility for selected services after phasing-out of the German contribution to the project on June 2003....

VISION

“Community Forestry Foundation-Quirino envisions empowered, efficiently nourished and environmentally – conscious communities of men and women from different ages and cultures, governed by legitimate partnership based on uncompromised commitment and dedication; steered by strong determination to sustainably protect, manage, conserve and equitably share its natural resources, aspiring for a peaceful and humane society founded on truth, freedom, justice and love driven by a strong belief that fervent prayers and faith in God Almighty gives meaning and purpose to human life.”

MISSION

“To ensure the sustained collaborative management amongst implementers of the CBFM in Quirino by implementing its mandate as stated in the Memorandum of Agreement, and to institutionalize and establish dynamic, independent, flexible and adapting, model and sustainable organization that assists other organizations.”

PURPOSE

1. To advocate effective policy and procedures for sustainable use of natural resources through participative and collaborative management practices;
2. To utilize a geographic information system as an integral part of landuse planning and management;
3. To develop knowledge of natural resource management; and
4. To enhance meaningful partnerships among People’s Organizations, Local Government, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and the private sector.

OBJECTIVES

1. Strengthen and consolidate People’s Organizations and local communities’ capacities to protect, manage and utilize in a sustainable manner their natural resources;
2. Have an effective alternative to one agency having responsibility for cross-sectoral program areas, namely: Collaborative Planning Management & Capacity Development (CPMCD), provision of Geographic Information System (GIS) Services, management of the Training Center, and Clonal Nursery Services;
3. Establish an effective partner of the provincial government and the DENR for continuity of selected program areas of CFPQ;
4. Effectively utilize selected assets turned-over by CFPQ to the provincial government and the DENR;

5. Realize a non-political base for support to Natural Resource Management on forest land, which is the Community-Based Forest Management (CBFM) program;
6. Create an institution that limits bureaucratic layers, facilitate a positive acceptance by public and private stakeholders, and responds to declared priorities; and;
7. Increase the potential for resource mobilization (access to funding agencies and investors) as well as public-private-partnerships.

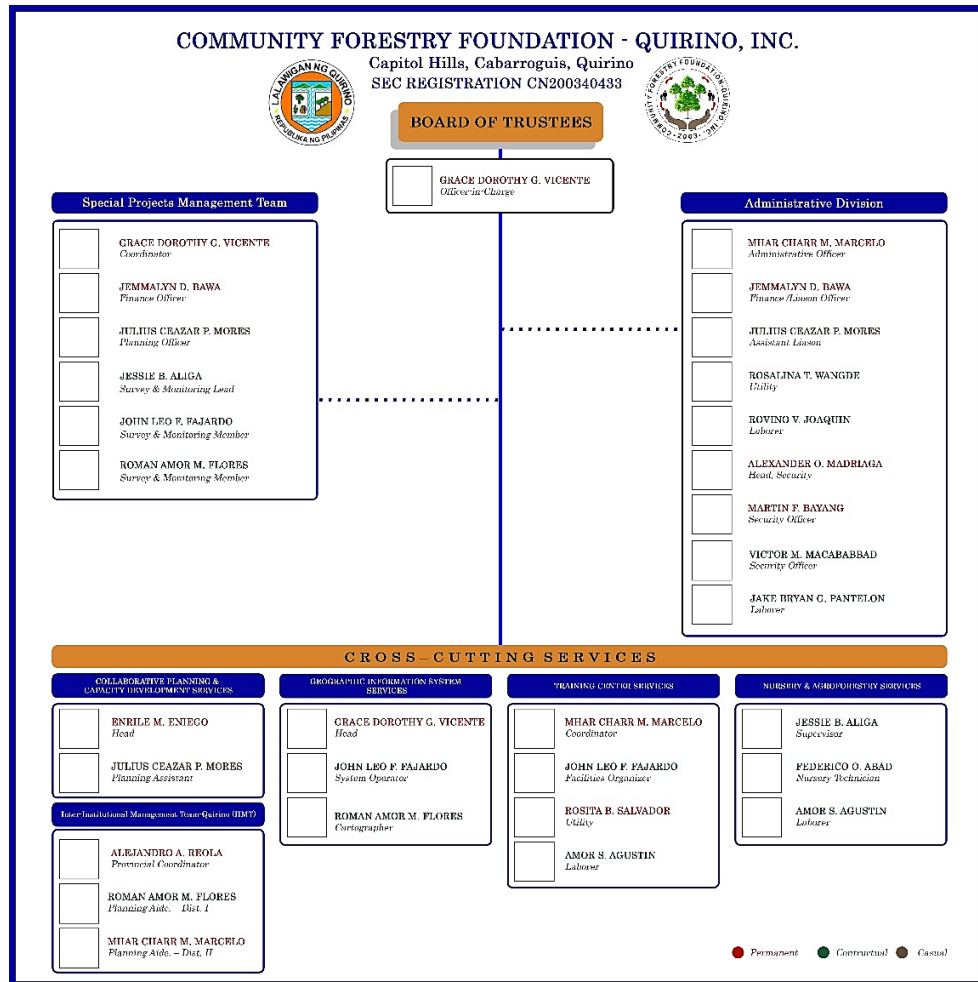

SERVICES

A. Collaborative Planning Management & Capacity Development Services (CPMCD)

Objectives

1. Organizes workshops and seminars with subjects ranging from collaborative planning to on-site monitoring of CBFM implementation.
2. Organizes municipal PO federation
3. Conducts training on CBFM, sustainable agriculture and livelihood programs
4. Networks and provide information flow among institutions concerned is an essential objective for service provision. The PO Profile documentation is an integral part of this service.

5. Supports policy monitoring activities that focus on advocacy as well as on the development and validation of meaningful mechanisms for collaborative management of natural resources.

B. Geographic Information System Services (GIS)

Objectives
